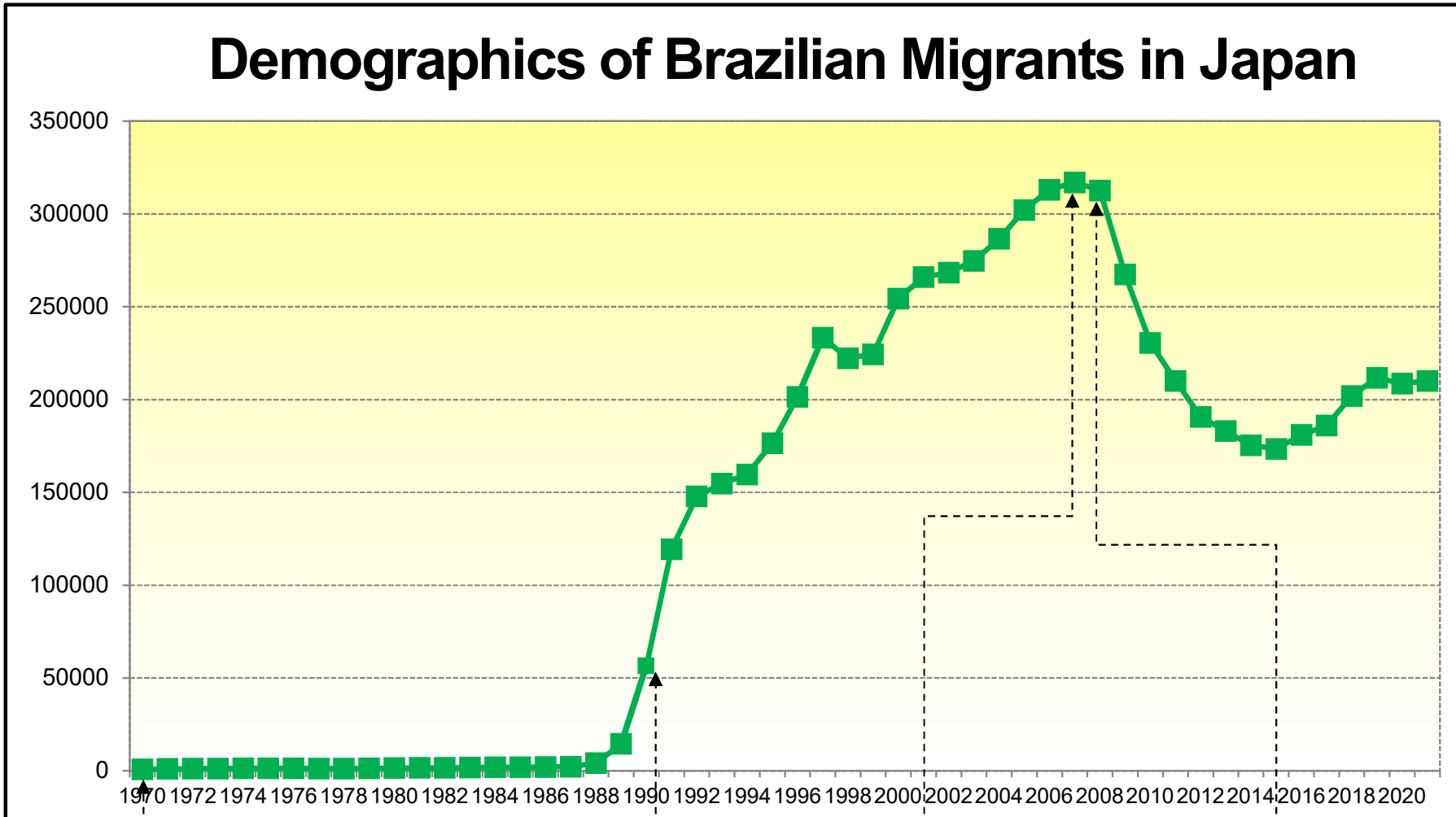

Brazilian Migrants in Japan Insight



In 1970, there was a registered Brazilian population of 891 in Japan. The population increased slightly to 1,492 in 1980.

The Initial Brazilian Migrants in Japan was observed in the 1970s.

The Immigration-Control and Refugee- Recognition Act in 1990 formally authorized Nikkei to come to work and stay in Japan.

The Japanese government authorized the legal entry of Japanese and their descendants until the 3rd generation in Japan.

The number of registered Brazilians in Japan reached 316,967 corresponding to 15.2% of the total registered foreigners in Japan as of 2007.

Brazilian population in Japan has grown until 2007.

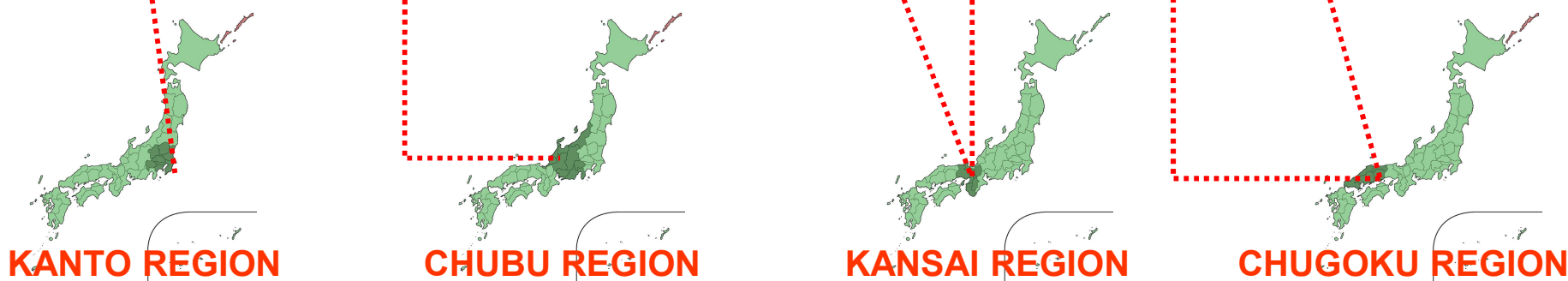
The global economic crisis affected the foreign migrants. Millions of foreign workers had lost their jobs and went to back to their homeland.

The declining trend of number of Brazilian migrants in Japan has begun to be observed after 2008.

There were 204,879 Brazilians registered in Japan as of December 2021

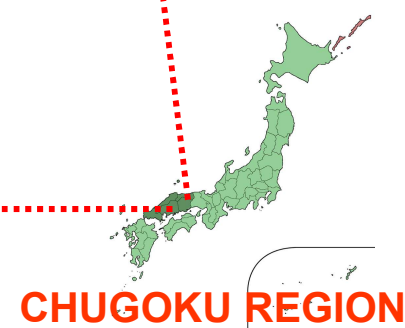
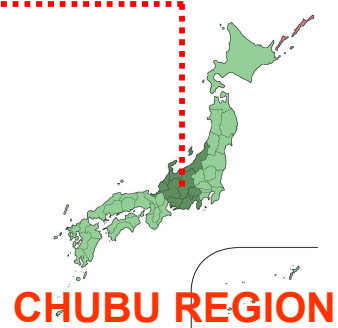

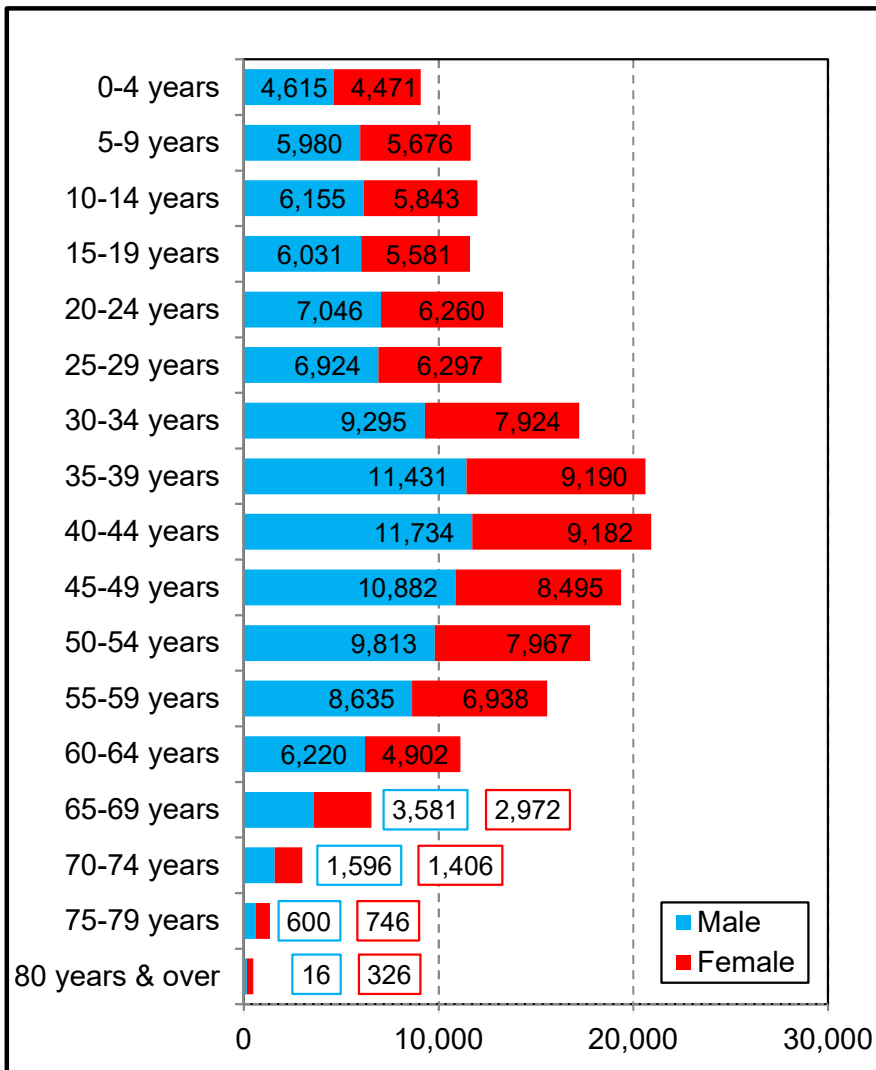
