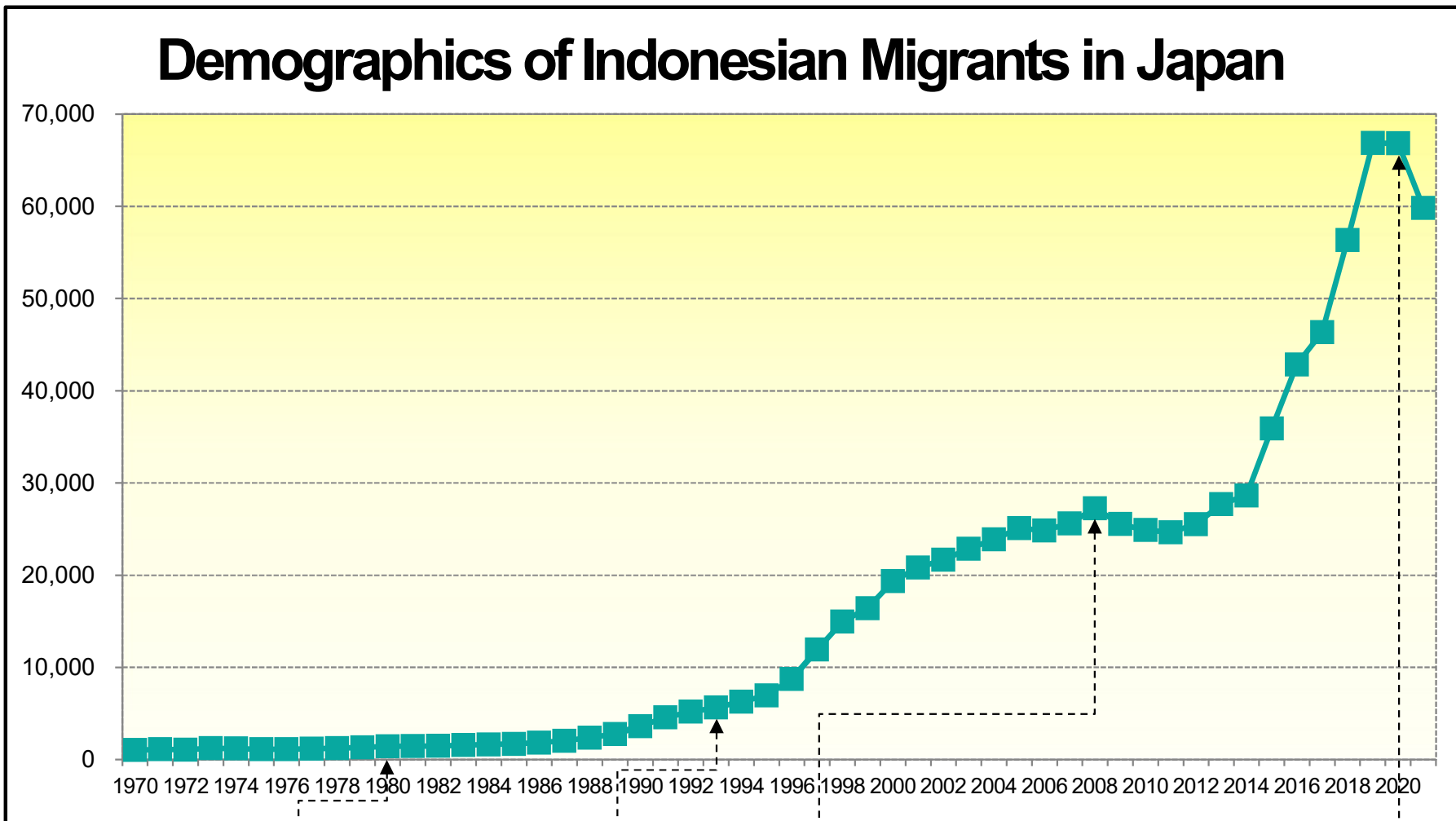

Indonesian Migrants in Japan Insight



Early Indonesian migrant workers constituted a significant part of the Indonesian migration trend to Japan since the 1980s.

Many Indonesian migrant workers who were mostly Minahasan people from North Sulawesi resided in Japanese port town of Oarai, in Ibaraki Prefecture and worked in the local seafood processing companies.

The number of Indonesian workers in Japan slightly increased, especially after the training period was extended to a maximum of 3 years.

Indonesia began to send their workers officially into Japan in early 1993 under the new program called "The Industrial Training and Technical Internship Program".

The first group of Indonesian candidates (104) for the position of registered nurse arrived in Japan in August 2008.

Between 2008 and 2011, nearly 800 Indonesian nurses and care workers have entered Japan as candidates for registered nurse under the Indonesia-Japan Economic Partnership Agreement.

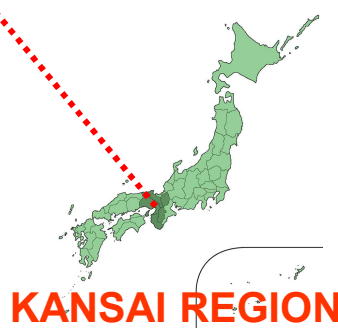
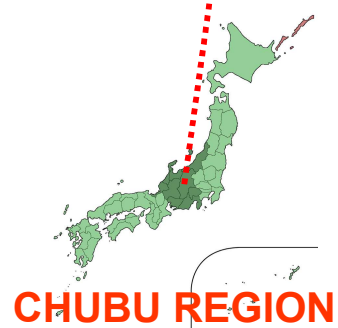
As of December 2020, the number of Indonesian technical intern trainees has reached 35,973, 53.8% of the population of Indonesians in Japan.

Foreign nationals who have finished a five-year technical intern training program has been allowed to stay and work with the Specific Skill Visa for 5 years since April 2019.

There were 59,820 Indonesians registered in Japan as of December 2021

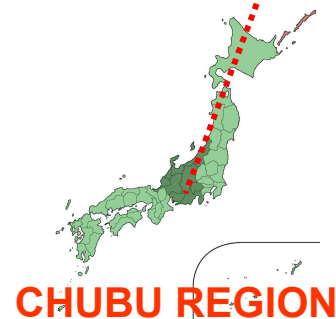
Aichi, Tokyo, Ibaraki, Kanagawa, Osaka and Shizuoka have the concentration and the largest population of Indonesians

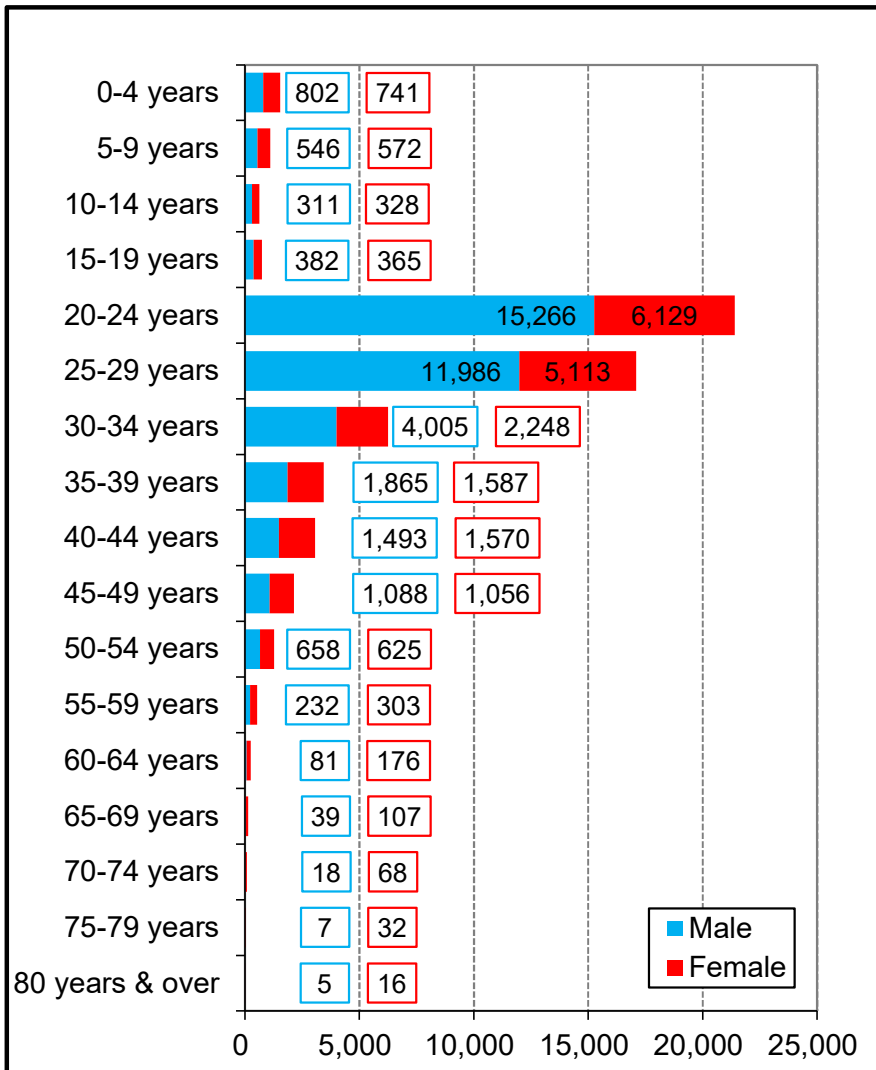
